from 5000-5500 m. The main centre of the high  
altitudes lies between 30°-35° N. Lat. and 100°-105° E.  
The highest peaks of the range occur in the northern  
part of the range where the maximum elevation  
is about 5000 m. The highest peak is Mount  
Kangchenjunga which rises to a height of 8032 m.  
The second highest peak is Mount Lhotse which  
rises to a height of 7946 m. The third highest peak  
is Mount Makalu which rises to a height of 7757 m.  
The fourth highest peak is Mount Cho Oyu which  
rises to a height of 7200 m. The fifth highest peak  
is Mount Dhaulagiri which rises to a height of 7000 m.  
The sixth highest peak is Mount Manaslu which  
rises to a height of 6900 m. The seventh highest peak  
is Mount Annapurna which rises to a height of 6900 m.
