Robin Dunnigan Says if Elected as US Ambassador to Georgia, She will Focus on Four Priorities

Robin Dunnigan, candidate for the US Ambassador to Georgia, told the Senate Foreign Relations Committee that if her candidacy is approved, she will work with the government and people of Georgia to help implement the desire for integration with the European Union and NATO.

According to Dunnigan, if she is approved as ambassador, she will focus on four priorities.

"First and foremost, my highest duty will be to ensure the safety of the team working at the US Embassy and all Americans in Georgia. Over the past 18 months I have worked to help secure our embassy team in a very challenging environment in Kyiv. I know that this responsibility is sacred; Second, if confirmed, I will work with the Government of Georgia and the people of Georgia to help them realize their desire for further integration with the EU, NATO and the West and advance a democratic future.

Euro-Atlantic integration will not only benefit the citizens of Georgia, I deeply believe that it is in the national interest of the United States. We want a democratic Georgia firmly integrated with the West, able to protect its borders and withstand the pressure of Russia's malicious actions, including Russian disinformation.

Georgia has made significant progress over the past $30~{\rm years}$,



but some disturbing developments show that there is still much to be done. The European Union has provided Georgia with a road map of reforms that it must complete this year in order to receive EU candidate status. If approved, I look forward to supporting Georgia in implementing these reforms;

Third, I will strengthen bilateral trade and investment, including by increasing opportunities for American companies in Georgia and Georgian invest-

ments in the US. I will vigorously promote US exports and encourage reforms to strengthen a fair and transparent business environment. I will also work with the Government of Georgia to protect against potential coercive economic practices, including from Russia and the People's Republic of China.

Russia's brutal war against Ukraine violates the most fundamental principles of the UN Charter on sovereignty and territorial integrity. Georgians know this Russian collection very well because they saw it happen in their own country in 2008 and they experience it every day because Russia still occupies about 20 percent of Georgia's territory;

My final priority will be to advocate for Georgia's sovereignty and territorial integrity. I am committed to working with Georgia and our international partners to ensure that Russia fulfills its obligations under the 2008 Ceasefire Agreement and the UN Charter. Our partnership has benefited both the people of Georgia and the US for the past 30 years. "Georgia has been a staunch NATO partner for peace since 1994 and has been the largest contributor of forces in Afghanistan among non-NATO countries, next to American troops," said Dunnigan.

US President Joe Biden nominated Robin Dunigan as a candidate for Ambassador to Georgia in February.

Public Defender Levan Ioseliani Calls on Gov't to Refrain from Speaking on Alleged Victims of Shalva Ramishvili

Public Defender Levan Ioseliani called on Georgian government representatives to refrain from talking about the alleged female victims in advance.

As Ioseliani mentioned, the relevant department is working on cases of alleged sexual violence.

"Regarding alleged victims of sexual violence and cases of harassment, the relevant department of the Public Defender is working intensively on this. We have published a statement on this and in the appropriate period we will provide you with what will be revealed, what will be established, what evidence will be provided to us. We are investigating all the information received by the Public Defender's office and we will provide you with the information," said Ioseliani.

When asked whether he sees the guilt of Shalva Ramishvili, the head of 'PosTV' who was accused of sexual misconduct by several women who government representatives referred to as bribed, the public defender noted that it is not in their competence to find Ramishvili guilty.

"We will not work on the issue of guilt, we are investigating the issue of possible harassment, the issue of guilt is the competence of other agencies. As for the statement of the government officials, I call on them to refrain from talking about the alleged female victims in advance, not to disclose the information to the public in advance. Their testimony and statements lead to some type of mistrust, such statements create the risk and possibility that other alleged victims will refrain from publishing such statements." Ioseliani stated.

US Ambassador to Georgia Candidate Says Georgian Gov't Wants to Comply with Sanctions Against Russia



Robin Dunnigan, candidate for the US Ambassador to Georgia, said at a hearing held in the Senate Foreign Relations Committee the Georgian government wants to comply with the sanctions against Russia.

According to Dunnigan, they have been asked for some training to help with this from the government and added that Georgia is very important in the international arena in passing resolutions condemning Russia's aggression.

As Dunnigan said, special sanctions coordinators and other agencies will travel to Georgia in the coming months to continue this dialogue.

"Compliance with sanctions is an absolute priority for us, the United States. We have a direct conversation with the Government of Georgia, the National Bank of Georgia, the private sector of Georgia and the financial sector of Georgia. The Government of Georgia wants to be in compliance with the sanctions and we have been approached to provide some training to help with this so that there is no circumvention of the sanctions. Georgia should absolutely understand that the US does not want to continue to finance Russia's war by evading sanctions for future aggressions.

We have this conversation with Georgia. Special sanctions coordinators and other agencies

will travel to Georgia in the coming months to continue this important dialogue. Georgia is also very important in the international arena, both in the UN and in the OSCE in support of Ukraine in passing resolutions that condemn Russian aggression. If I am approved as an ambassador, I will continue to help the Georgian government in this regard," stated Dunnigan.
