phasizing that China ranks among the top five trade partners of Georgia. Furthermore, it was noted that the trade turnover between Georgia and China exceeded 1.5 billion US

dollars from January to Novem-

Successful cooperation between the two countries was emphasized in terms of the degeopolitical location, which increases Georgia's potential as a West-East connecting corridor.

Kobakhidze expressed the velopment of Georgia's special strong support of the Georgian

government for the One China principle, while the parties reaffirmed mutual support for each other's sovereignty and territorial integrity.

Papuashvili, noted during the industrial emissions, tourism, presentation of the 2023 report to the Parliament that 65 plenary sessions were held and 622 laws were adopted in 2023.

He expressed concern that the opposition has rarely participated in discussing these crucial laws, despite their significance for the well-being of the population and Georgia's alignment with the European Union.

"Among the adopted laws, no-The Chairman of the Parlia-ment of Georgia, Shalva table ones include: laws on the management of water resources, public procurement, electronic commerce, personal data protection, Defense Code, Penal Code, and amendments to the Law on Broadcasting. Unfortunately, with rare exceptions, the opposition has hardly participated in the discussion of such laws. However, it is issues like these that are crucial for improving the well-being of our population and for our essential alignment with European Union," Papuashvili stated.
