BriefHistoryoftheInstitute

The South Caucasus Institute of Regional Security (SCIRS) was created in April 2002 as a result of a joint initiative of the Georgian National Committee of the Helsinki Citizens' Assembly and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Georgia, supported by the Ministries of Foreign Affairs of Armenia and Azerbaijan as well as the Friedrich Ebert Foundation.

SCIRS is a non-profit international organization that understands itself as a 'think tank' with a network structure. The Institute conducts interdisciplinary academic research and preparing young experts.

Mission of the Institute

SCIRS unites experts and analysts working on the problems of the countries of the South Caucasus as well as its neighbors, through academic, governmental, societal and international organizations.
